FUTURE HEALTH SERVICES IN ARGYLL AND CLYDE

NHS Argyll and Clyde will be dissolved on 31 March 2006. Renfrewshire will join NHS Greater Glasgow.

Patients will continue to use local healthcare services and attend the nearest appropriate hospital, as they do at present. The changes relate to the administration of health care rather than where and how patients are treated.

Abolishing Argyll and Clyde should produce NHS Boards better structured to for the needs of their communities. Patients will continue to access the same services as they do now.

Writing off the boards £80m debt means that although the new boards still have tough decisions to make, they will not be burdened with a legacy of past problems.

Patients will continue to use hospital services where they always have done.

More teachers for Renfrewshire

The Scottish Executive has announced that Renfrewshire is to receive over £2million extra funding for new teachers over the next 2 years.

The cash will reduce class sizes even further; give teachers more time for marking, preparation and to employ extra visiting specialists.

Our education system should give every pupil the support, encouragement and opportunity to be the best they can be.

Linwood cash machine restored

Residents of Linwood recently contacted me about the withdrawal of their free to use cash machine at the Linwood shopping centre.

I took up the issue with the relevant banking authorities and the machine operators as part of a campaign with Linwood Community Council and Councillor Anne Hall.

The operators Cardpoint finally contacted my office to agree that



they will reinstate the machine.

This is good news for Linwood who will now continue to have a free to use cash point in their local community.

Pulling the plug on water charges

Scotland deserves a modern and efficient public water service to deliver better quality drinking water, cleaner rivers and beaches and higher customer standards. But bills also need to be reasonable.

The Scottish Executive has announced that a limit of less than inflation rises has been placed on domestic water charges from next year – and for the next four years. Other good news for low income households is that they will, for the first time, be eligible for a reduction in charges of up to 25%.

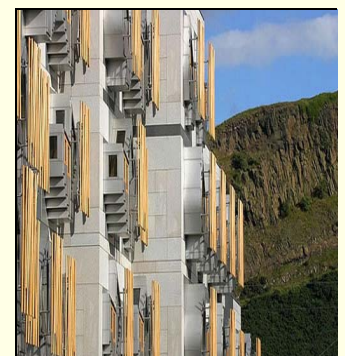
Would you like to visit Holyrood?
